End Point Assessment (EPA) Completion and Certification

An interview will take place to identify any prior knowledge, skills and behaviours. A skills analysis will be completed alongside maths and English testing if required. This will identify if the apprenticeship is accessible and appropriate. This may identify a reduction in the programme length is required. This will be discussed on an individual basis with the school.

Based on the initial assessment, an individualised delivery plan will be agreed with you and your employer. This will include on and off the job training. Spencer Apprenticeships will use a blended approach of online and face to face teaching, 1-1 sessions in the work place and webinars.

You will be assessed via an external End Point Assessor.
This will be a practical observation with questions
& answers and a professional discussion supported by a portfolio of evidence.
Performance in the EPA will

determine the apprenticeship grade of distinction, pass or fail. The EPA consists of two distinct methods:

- Practical observation with Q&A
- Professional discussion supported by a portfolio of evidence.

Upon successful completion of the end point assessment you will have fully demonstrated your competence in the subject area and be awarded with your Apprenticeship certificate. In the unlikely event you don't pass, further learning will take place before a resit is undertaken.

The TA Apprenticeships team strive to provide an exceptional programme of learning through a blend of taught sessions with experienced facilitators, placement days in alternative settings, such as St Giles Spencer and Foxwood Academy, and one to one tutor reviews. 

If you decide you would like to proceed with the Apprenticeship route, you will be eligible for an NUS apprentice card which can save you discounts in selected retailers, restaurants and more.






CAREER PATHWAYS



Part of your Apprenticeship will include ongoing careers guidance and advice, to help you decide your future pathway. This will include placement days, teacher training information sessions, tutor reviews and newsletters. We work in partnership with Futures Careers Advice to ensure you also have access to external careers advice and support.



FUNCTIONAL SKILLS





Functional Skills Maths and English are an essential part of every apprenticeship course. If you haven't already achieved GCSE Grade 4/C (or other equivalent Maths/English qualification) you will need to achieve Functional Skills Level 2 Maths and Functional Skills English qualifications.

With the support and guidance of your tutor, you will work through a Maths and English learning plan, created following the completion of a diagnostic assessment at the start of the course. There are final assessments for these which will be agreed with your employer and trainer in advance.
